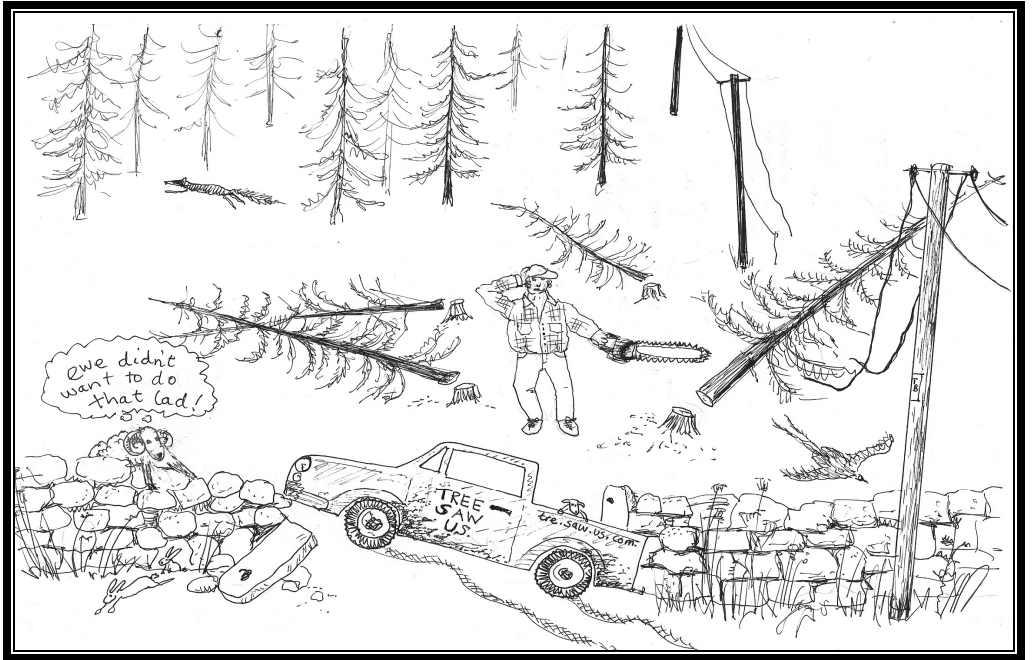

Broadband in Farndale

The Moorsweb Broadband service in Farndale continues to trundle along reasonably well, and members are certainly working it hard. Membership numbers are generally steady although members come and go as people leave Farndale and new neighbours arrive. The biggest issue facing us in the near future is without doubt the growth in data traffic as members utilise the Internet more heavily in their daily lives.

My analogy for this is a comparison to the time we started Moorsweb 3 years ago when many people had just one car and went to Kirby once a week. Now many people have two cars/pickups & a trailer and a surprising number have a lorry too and they use all of them for a load of stuff several times a week. Meanwhile the road has been widened to 2 lanes and lots of detail improvements made along the way, but it is still congested at busy times. We are considering ways to manage this as it is unsustainable in the longer term, and although there will be no immediate change, we are considering reducing the monthly road tax and charging according to usage. Usage will probably be defined by the amount of data carried. Examples of low data usage are web pages, online shopping and a few emails. Moderate data usage is music and radio. Heavy usage is video and TV. We are also considering further "road widening", recognising that even if we charge by usage, usage is still going to grow as members use more internet services.

Any other ideas would be appreciated, and if any of you would like to let me know your opinions I'd be pleased to have a chat by whichever means you prefer. Email, phone or stopping me along the dale are all generally fine unless I'm already late for a customer.

Finally, just to say we have still had occasional breakdowns in some parts of the network which we've done our best to fix as soon as we've known about them. If you know of a problem, please don't wait for someone else to tell us, give the helpdesk and ring and let us know.

Parish Council Matters

A Parish Council meeting for Farndale East was held on Tuesday, 7th July 2009 at 8pm at the Village Hall. Those present were Ken Wilson (chairman), Brian Aconley, Elisabeth Castle, Richard Potter, Dennis Wilson and Dave Mead (Clerk).

Dave Mead has received notice of a proposed footpath diversion at North Gill from NYMNPA. Dave confirmed he had spoken to all the council members (aside from Richard Potter, whose application this is) in the weeks before this meeting, as any comments they wished to make had to be sent to NYMNPA before 26th June 2009. Richard then explained the details for those who had not seen a map and it was confirmed that the council had nothing to add.

Dave Mead has received a letter from RDC relating to the Gamblint 2005. RDC are wishing to consult with parish councils and the like on their new Statement of Principles regarding the above act. The Council as a whole agreed they had no comment to make.

Dave Mead has received invitations for the Joint Parish Forum being held this year at Sneaton Castle Centre, Whitby on 4th August 2009. Dave agreed to contact councillors nearer the time to see who wishes to attend.

Dave Mead has received notice of a temporary road closure from NYCC. This is described as the "C62 Daleside Road". It was agreed that this must relate to the work about to start on the West Side and that no action is required on the East.

Richard Potter suggested starting up a Farm Watch scheme in view of recent events in the dale (the theft of Chris Wilson's ATV being the main one). Dave Mead confirmed that he has already made some enquiries and would now pursue this further and report back at the next meeting.

Elisabeth Castle has resigned from the Parish Council and following the usual procedures, Dave Mead has been co-opted onto the council to replace her. The decision was unanimous.

The next meeting will be held on 1st September 2009 at the Village Hall at 8pm. The meeting closed at 9.30pm.
